Dawn

From the beginning...

Isaiah 46:9-10 King James Version (KJV)

- ⁹ Remember the former things of old: for I am God, and there is none else; I am God, and there is none like me,
- ¹⁰ Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure:

We can know the end from the beginning! In light of this verse, let's set a foundation <u>first</u>... *from the beginning*.

Genesis 1:1-2 King James Version (KJV)

- 1 In the beginning God *created* the heaven and the earth.
- ² And the earth was without form, and void; and *darkness* was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

1 In the beginning God *created* the heaven and the earth.

<u>Created</u> - Strongs 1254: A primitive root; <u>(absolutely)</u> to <u>create</u>; (qualified) to <u>cut</u> down (a wood), <u>select</u>, <u>feed</u> (as formative processes): - choose, create (creator), cut down, dispatch, do, make (fat).

Also Strongs H853: Apparently contracted from H226 in the demonstrative sense of *entity*; properly *self* (but generally used to point out more definitely the object of a verb or preposition, *even* or *namely*):

- (As such unrepresented in English.)

² And the earth was without form, and void; and *darkness* was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

<u>Darkness</u> - Strongs H2822: From H2821; the dark; hence (literally) darkness; figuratively misery, destruction, death, ignorance, sorrow, wickedness: - dark (-ness), night, obscurity.

Genesis 1:3 King James Version (KJV)

³ And God *said*, Let there be *light*: and there was *light*.

<u>Light</u> - Strongs H216: From H215; <u>illumination</u> or (concretely) <u>luminary</u> (in every sense, including <u>lightning</u>, <u>happiness</u>, etc.): - bright, clear, + day, light (-ning), morning, sun.

We know this *light* is <u>not the sun</u>. The sun was made to be the primary light in the sky on the 4th day (Genesis 1:14-19); not the 1st day.

?? What is this light ??

Genesis 1:4-5 King James Version (KJV)

- ⁴ And God saw the light, that it was good: and God *divided* the light from the darkness.
- ⁵ And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day.

Evening and Morning - Important Focus

Evening - Strongs H6153: From H6150; **dusk**: - + day, even (-ing, tide), night.

H6150: A primitive root (rather identical with H6148 through the idea of covering with a texture); to **grow dusky** at sundown: - be darkened, (toward) evening.

<u>Dusk</u> - 1828 Noah Webster Dictionary: A tending to darkness, or moderately dark; a middle degree between light and darkness

NOTE: Evening/dusk contains <u>both</u> light and darkness (not fully light and not fully dark)

Evening and Morning - Important Focus

<u>Morning</u> - Strongs H1242: From H1239; properly <u>dawn</u> (as the <u>break</u> of day); generally <u>morning</u>: - (+) day, early, morning, morrow.

H1230: A primitive root; properly to *plough*, or (generally) *break forth*, that is, (figuratively) to *inspect*, *admire*, *care for*, *consider*: - (make) inquire (-ry), (make) search, seek out.

<u>Dawn</u>: 1828 Webster's Dictionary: To <u>begin to grow light</u> in the morning; to grow light; as, the day dawns

Remember, just like evening / dusk, morning/dawn contains both light and darkness (not fully light and not fully dark).

Evening and Morning Summary

Both the evening and the morning are **not** the night and the day.

Evening and morning are times of mixture <u>before and after</u> the day - they include <u>both light and darkness</u>.

Evening is the time of day when the darkness **encroaches** upon the light to bring in the darkness of night.

Morning is the time of day when the light first breaks through or penetrates the darkness to bring in the light of day.

Question about Evening and Morning

Which of these -
evening or morning -
do you believe came first?

Yahuah (the Light) was first!

We must establish that the Creator, our Father, came first!

Back to verse 1:

In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.

Is Yahuah light?

This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. 1 John 1:5

He was first before anything, thus the Light was first!

The darkness came afterwards

The darkness in verse 2 came about <u>after</u> Yahuah created in verse 1...

2 And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

<u>Was</u>- Strongs H1961: A primitive root (compare H1933); to <u>exist</u>, that is, <u>be</u> <u>or become</u>, <u>come to pass</u> (always emphatic, and not a mere copula or auxiliary): - beacon, X altogether, be (-come, accomplished, committed, like), break, cause, come (to pass), continue, do, faint, fall, + follow, happen, X have, last, pertain, quit (one-) self, require, X use.

Is it possible that the earth "became" to be without form, and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep?

The Light was first!

Do you agree?

The Light was first,

because the Creator was first.

The Creator is Light!

The Light was first!

So if we know the Light was first, and we know the Light broke through the darkness that was upon the earth on the first day, then wouldn't it stand to reason that the biblical day would follow this pattern??

The day, being the full cycle of day to night, began with the first break of light...

The "morning" (dawn)

Full summary

The *light* came first in verse 1 with a perfect creation, because the Creator was present. Something happened after verse 1 to bring *darkness* of misery and destruction. Yahuah penetrated this wicked darkness with the *light* of His spoken word; it broke through to "illuminate" this miserable and destructive *darkness*.

In the *light* of this first day, Yahuah worked to separate the *light* from the darkness, calling the *light Day* and the darkness *Night*. Then came the *evening* (dusk mixture), when the darkness began to encroach upon the *light* of the day. Then there was the *night*.

Once *night* was fully come on the first day/cycle, then the *light* broke through the darkness, bringing the *morning* (dawn mixture) which began the second day/cycle.

The first day/cycle was then complete.

NOTE: Both morning (dawn) and evening (dusk) are the times of "mixture" before and after the fullness of the day. These are BOTH included as part of the day season because they both contain light.

Turning our focus...

Now let us turn our focus to...

The morning (dawn)

Ponder this... If the "morning" (dawn) is the time of the day when the light breaks through or penetrates the darkness of night - before the sun comes up...

- What is actually going on here?
- Who is the light breaking through the darkness?
- What does this represent?

"Morning" is dawn

Remember that the "morning" (dawn) is defined in the Hebrew as:

- Strongs H1242: From H1239; properly dawn (as the break of day); generally morning: (+) day, early, morning, morrow.
 - H1230: A primitive root; properly to *plough*, or (generally) *break forth*, that is, (figuratively) to *inspect*, *admire*, *care for*, *consider*: (make) inquire (-ry), (make) search, seek out.

Break - break forth - as with force??

Who is the Light that broke through?

John 8:12 King James Version (KJV)

¹² Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, *I am the light of the world*: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.

John 12:46 King James Version (KJV)

⁴⁶ I am come a *light into the world*, that whosoever believeth on me should not abide in darkness.

Revelation 22:16 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁶ I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the *bright and morning star*.

Our questions again, answered!

What is actually going on at morning/dawn?

The Light breaks through, pierces, or penetrates the darkness of night!!

Who is the *Light*?

The only begotten Son of the Most High!

What does this represent or replicate?

The very first day of creation when the *Light* broke through the miserable darkness that had come upon the face of the deep!

What else does this represent/replicate?

Morning/Dawn also replicates when the Light broke through the miserable darkness in us!!

Through the tender mercy of our God; whereby the dayspring from on high hath visited us, to give light to them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace. Luke 1:78-79

For God, who commanded the **light** to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the **light** of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. 2 Corinthians 4:4

Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light: who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son... Colossians 1:12-13

Even further - what else is replicated?

The *Morning/Dawn* also replicates when the *Light* will once again break through the miserable darkness of the earth <u>at the end!!</u> The scriptures strongly allude that Yahusha will come back when it is night or dark and with spiritual darkness upon the earth:

While the bridegroom tarried, they all slumbered and slept. And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him. Matthew 25:5-6

I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work. John 9:4

Even further - what else is replicated? (cont)

Immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken:

Matthew 24:29

Blessed are those servants, whom the lord when he cometh shall find watching: verily I say unto you, that he shall gird himself, and make them to sit down to meat, and will come forth and serve them. And if he shall come in the second watch, or come in the third watch [of the night], and find them so, blessed are those servants.

Dawn is a loving reminder to us!

He uses the *dawn* to remind us <u>every day</u> of the powerful breakthrough into the darkness, or the victory over darkness, by His Son (the *Light*) --- the victory in the beginning at creation, in us now, and at the end of all things.

This daily reminder is a sign of His intense love for us.

This gives us every reason to cherish the *dawn* like no other time!

This time of the day is so very special that...

Job 38:7 King James Version (KJV)

⁷ When the *morning stars* sang together, and all the sons of God *shouted for joy*?

"Morning Stars" - morning = dawn (H1242) + stars = (H3556) figuratively, a prince or stars

"Shouted for Joy" - These "Sons of God" are angels/heavenly princes, and they are shouting for joy in the morning (dawn)!

Why would these "morning stars" be shouting for joy?

Isaiah 60:1 King James Version (KJV)

60 Arise, shine; for thy *light is come*, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee.

Isaiah 9:2 King James Version (KJV)

² The people that walked in darkness have seen a *great light*: they that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the *light* shined.

Why would these "morning stars" be shouting for joy? (cont)

Psalm 30:5 King James Version (KJV)

⁵ For his anger endureth but a moment; in his favour is life: weeping may endure for a night, but *joy cometh in the morning*.

Lamentations 3:22-23 King James Version (KJV)

²² It is of the LORD's *mercies* that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. ²³ They are *new every morning*: great is thy faithfulness.

The diamonds in the dawn are for us!

So if each *morning / dawn* is a repeat or replica of the victory of light over darkness, then we know the following are available to us specifically at this time:

- Victory
- Mercy
- Joy

Restoration and Refreshing

Every **morning / dawn**, we are given an invitation to experience these blessings of salvation. Shouldn't we answer this invitation and seek Him at this time?!

Yes, we should seek Him at dawn!

Proverbs 8:17 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁷ I love them that love me; and those that seek me *early* shall find me.

<u>Early</u> - Strongs H7836: A primitive root; properly to <u>dawn</u>, that is, (figuratively) be (up) early at any task (with the implication of earnestness); by extension to <u>search</u> for (with painstaking): - [do something] betimes, enquire early, rise (seek) betimes, <u>seek</u> (<u>diligently</u>) early, in the morning).

Yes, we should seek Him at dawn!

Psalm 5:3 King James Version (KJV)

³ My voice shalt thou hear in the *morning*, O LORD; in the *morning* will I direct my prayer unto thee, and will look up.

<u>Morning</u> - Strongs H1242: From H1239; properly <u>dawn</u> (as the break of day); generally morning: - (+) day, early, morning, morrow.

Yahusha sought His Father at dawn

Mark 1:35 King James Version (KJV)

³⁵ And in the *morning*, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed.

<u>Morning</u> - Strongs G1773: Neuter of a compound of G1722 and G3571; (adverbially) by night: - before day.

Victory at dawn!

Isaiah 58:8 King James Version (KJV)

⁸ Then shall thy light break forth as the *morning*, and thine health shall spring forth speedily: and thy righteousness shall go before thee; the glory of the LORD shall be thy reward.

<u>Morning</u> - Strongs H7837: From H7836; dawn (literally, figuratively or adverbially): - day (-spring), early, light, morning, whence riseth.

Mercy at dawn!

Psalm 90:14 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁴ O satisfy us *early* with thy *mercy*; that we may *rejoice and be glad* all our days.

<u>Morning</u> - Strongs H1242: From H1239; properly <u>dawn</u> (as the break of day); generally morning: - (+) day, early, morning, morrow.

Hope of His return at dawn!

Matthew 24:27 King James Version (KJV)

²⁷ For as the *lightning* cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

Does this sound like *dawn* - the light comes out of the east and then shines even unto the west?

<u>Lightening</u> - Strongs G796: From G797; lightning; by analogy glare: - lightning, bright shining.

<u>Cometh</u> - Strongs G1831: From G1537 and G2064; *to issue* (literally or figuratively): - come-(forth, out), depart (out of), escape, get out, go (abroad, away, forth, out, thence), *proceed (forth)*, spread abroad.

He will satisfy us at dawn

Psalm 90:14 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁴ O *satisfy* us *early* with thy mercy; that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

Early - Strongs H1242: From H1239; properly **dawn** (as the **break** of day); generally morning: - (+) day, early, morning, morrow.

And finally, the dawn is prophetic

2 Peter 1:19 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁹ We have also a more sure word of *prophecy*; whereunto ye do well that ye *take heed*, as unto a *light* that shineth in a dark place, until the day *dawn*, and the day star arise in your hearts...
